It is the beginning of the many summer activities and community events! Tourist season has begun and the first RV's have been spotted in the local campgrounds and at the local attractions.

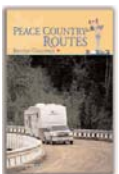
Dawson Creek Visitor Centre

The downtown historic self-guided walking tour is in its 4th year. This year a major revision on the walking tour has been expanded to include some new features. The first addition is the murals of Memory Lane. Memory Lane is the alley between the Chamber of Commerce building and the Alaska Hotel. Businesses from times gone by and a 1940's scene of the main street of Dawson Creek are the themes of this unique project. Community Tourism Essentials May 10, 2006

The Review of the Community Tourism Essentials and Introduction of the America Scenic Byways Workshops was held in early May. The much anticipated workbook was reviewed with over 50 stakeholders and interested parties. The workbook identified the Strengths and Weaknesses of Dawson Creek. From the Weaknesses, five categories were identified that needed improvement: Attractions, Services, Hospitality, Infrastructure, and Promotion, with 26 specific actions that needs to be addressed. Within those five categories workshop attendees created a "Top Ten" priority list. Here the major issues preventing the growth of tourism for our community were identified and target. The Top Ten Priority list are:

We are very grateful to the meeting facilitator, Ad Van Haaften, Guest speaker Don Foxgord from Tourism British Columbia and the Northern Rockies Alaska Highway Tourism Association for bringing their experience and knowledge of tourism development to Dawson Creek. These workshop findings will help Tourism Dawson Creek prepare for the presentation of a tourism development plan to City Council at the end of May.
