Alaska Highway House: Dawson Creek's newest attraction begins!

A must-see for all residents! Located in downtown Dawson Creek on the SW corner of the Mile 0 Post intersection, Alaska Highway House officially got underway in January, 2007. Weeks of demolition and renovations were completed and pre-fab exhibits and state of the art audio-visual equipment arrived with installation completed by June. Realizing 5 years of work, Alaska Highway House was opened to the public (July 4, 2007) with a memorable celebration in the city centre. With 10th Street blocked off, dignitaries, media, invited guests and the public were treated to presentations, red, white and blue decorations, 1940's music, a WWII vehicle display and a street barbecue. All of this culminated with a ribbon cutting and the première viewing of Alaska Highway House. We encourage everyone to drop in, see Alaska Highway House and be amazed! Hours (winter) are Monday to Friday: 9am – 5pm.

**Marketing****Consumer Shows**

In conjunction with Northern Rockies Alaska Highway Tourism Association (NRAHTA), Tourism Dawson Creek (TDC) attended three consumer shows: the Rock, Gem and RV Show in Quartzite, Arizona (a ten day trade show that attracts up to 200,000 RV'ers from all of North America), the Edmonton Motorcycle Show and the Fraser Valley Sports and Outdoor Show.

TDC also attended the American Bus Association (ABA) Marketplace in Grapevine, Texas as liaison to the Travel Trade (bus and caravan tours). This opportunity affords a face-to-face contact in private appointments with tour companies from Canada, U.S.A, Mexico and Overseas. Tours that already travel here are encouraged to stay longer by being made aware of what there is to see & do in Dawson Creek and potential tours are approached to make Dawson Creek a future destination.

For the 2nd year, TDC staff attended the local Bridal Show held annually at the George Dawson Inn. Wireless Dawson Creek

Another first for Dawson Creek! *DC Wireless (Step Out & Log On)*. TDC and the Peace Region Internet Society launched a free wireless network in the downtown core and at Pioneer Village. This venture allows laptop and PDA users free internet access for 2 hours in our hot spots. Proving to be a very popular program it is another way to set Dawson Creek aside as a unique and memorable destination.

Tourist in Your Own Town Month

This past June we encouraged city and area residents to explore their local attractions, natural wonders and attend home events to gain a better understanding and awareness. For 2007, Mounties at Mile 0 Photo Op, Multi-plex, museum and downtown mural tours were just a few of the events offered.

RV Research

TDC partnered with several stakeholders to conduct an in depth *RV Travelers Study*, a follow-up to 2003 research. As RVs are the largest part of our visitation, the aim of this research was to develop insights into the RV market to better service and increase this rubber tire travel. Qualitative and quantitative information was gathered from travelers including: motivations, expectations, perceptions and information search and decision-making behaviors.
