Welcome to Tourism Dawson Creek

To increase awareness and to let you know what is going on at Tourism Dawson Creek, we have launched the Mile "0" Signal. This a quarterly newsletter that will be sent out to 400 plus stakeholders, operators and other interested groups.

Tourism Dawson Creek works to promote, attract and retain the business of tourism in the City of Dawson Creek. Our mission is to "coordinate opportunities for sustainable tourism growth and development by fostering memorable, year-round visitor experiences and promote social and economic benefits for our members and wider community". This includes roles of communication, marketing and promotion, education, and development. Tourism Dawson Creek has many activities and areas in which we assist visitors and residents. Marketing

Tourism Dawson Creek has just completed the consumer show blitz. Our staff, (Keltie Durrell and Deb Chaffee) and the Northern Rockies Alaska Highway Tourism Association staff attended two consumer shows: the *Edmonton RV Show* and the *Fraser Valley Boat, Sport Fishing and Outdoor Show*. There is a lot of interest in touring, snowmobiling, quading and fishing throughout our area and the Alberta and lower mainland market continues to be very strong for Dawson Creek.

Mile "0" to Adventure Visitor Guide

In cooperation with the Dawson Creek & District Chamber of Commerce and the City of Dawson Creek, Tourism Dawson Creek has published 40,000 copies of the 2006 edition of the *Mile "0" to Adventure Visitor Guide*. We are in the process of distribution to Visitor Centres and tourist destinations across Canada and the U.S.

Dawson Creek to Dawson City

The Klondike Visitors' Association (KVA) of Dawson City, Yukon and Tourism Dawson Creek have partnered to promote our two cities. The Dawson to Dawson collateral piece is a coupon marketing scheme to encourage travelers to stop in at Dawson Creek and Dawson City. This is the first year for the Dawson to Dawson promotion. KVA and Tourism Dawson Creek have circulated the publication at several trade and consumer shows. This summer we expect to see the positive effects of this campaign.





Visitor Center

Tourism Dawson Creek operates Dawson Creek's Visitor Centre which is located in the Station Museum at the Northern Alberta Railways Park. Visitor information counsellors are available year-round. This is a visitor's first point of contact when arriving in our community. Certified counsellors assist in finding accommodation, eateries, things to do, road and weather reports, events and complete travel planning info, etc... These services have a direct impact in giving the visitor a positive impression of Dawson Creek.

Development

Community Tourism Essential Workshop and Review

In February of 2006, Tourism Dawson Creek invited the community to take part in developing a *strategic plan* for tourism in the city. A two-day workshop began by reviewing past initiatives in Dawson Creek in terms of planning and implementation.

The second portion identified strengths and weaknesses in the city. From the issues raised, it was determined what needs the most improvement, and a timeline was formed for resolving these weaknesses. Tourism Dawson Creek would like to thank all those individuals who participated. We are now in the process of shaping those outcomes into a five-year plan to direct the focus of our activities. Participants will be contacted to review the summary workbooks and together plan towards a better future.

SuperHost

Since 1985, *SuperHost* training has been taught in British Columbia to improve the service experience in our province. Tourism Dawson Creek is the delivery organization for SuperHost in Dawson Creek, Pouce Coupe and Tumbler Ridge. The next SuperHost Fundamentals course is scheduled for this spring in mid-April.
